SAY:	allow charitable raffles to take place at rodeo events, in line with its current authority to allow such raffles at other professional sporting events. Following its enactment by the 84th Legislature, HJR 73 by Geren, authorizing charitable raffles at professional sporting events, was put to the voters as Proposition 4 in the election on November 3, 2015, and was approved overwhelmingly. Since the approval of Prop. 4, charitable raffles have raised large amounts of money for worthy causes related to education, cancer research, and youth programs. HJR 143 simply would extend the Legislature's authority to allow similar charitable raffles to be held at rodeo events.
CRITICS SAY:	No concerns identified.
NOTES:	HB 3012 by Geren, the enabling legislation for HJR 143, is set for second reading consideration today.
	According to the Legislative Budget Board, any fiscal implication to the state would be attributable to the corresponding enabling legislation. The cost for publication of the resolution would be \$178,333.
